SSWG put on a great symposium. It was well organized, held in a top notch venue and had an impressive line-up of demonstrators including David Ellsworth, J Paul Fennell, Jacque Vesery - 7 demonstrators in total.

Each demonstrator presented 2 different demonstrations. There were 4 demonstrations running simultaneously, with 4 sets of demonstrations on saturday and 3 more sets on sunday, followed by a forum discussion and auction Sunday afternoon. With a total of 28 demonstrations over 7 rotations there was something for everyone - the only problem was picking and choosing which demos to attend as possible it wasn't to attend every demonstration. There were several I would have liked to have seen but couldn't fit them all in.

There were demonstrations on bowl making, hollow forms, embellishing, layout for carving, carving, form, colouring and painting. All of the sessions I attended were excellent.

Two common themes throughout sessions I attended were 1) form trumps everything, even a strikingly pretty piece of wood. As Jacque

Vesery put it, "a dog bowl is just a dog bowl, no matter how wonderful the wood is"

2) Practice and practice some more. By making more than one of a form (ie: make several) you will improve the forms that you make and they will become more refined and pleasing.

Our Guild was represented by Dan Michener, Remie Benoitt and Vern Miller all of whom found it a very worthwhile weekend.
