Tip of the Month

Clean up the knicks and gouges in your tool rest with a file and apply a light coating of wax. This will allow your tools to slide smoothly along the tool rest and make smooth flowing curves much more easily attainable.

If you do this every day you turn it won't take much effort compared to if you leave it go for long periods of time.
