During the holidays I renewed my membership in the American Association of Woodturners and then I registered for the 2018 AAW symposium to be held in Portland, Oregon in June. The symposium organizers have made a deal with a hotel near the convention centre, so I made a room reservation for 3 nights. Registration for the Symposium cost 325 US dollars, but if I hadn't been an AAW member registration would have been an extra \$120. Several of our members have expressed a desire to attend the Portland Symposium; I encourage you to go because it's not very often that these AAW Symposiums are within a reasonable distance of Alberta. There has been some informal discussion of a group from our Guild driving together, and at least a couple are planning on taking their motorhomes. There are also flights from Calgary.

Next May 19, 20 & 21st we are hosting J. Paul Fennell as a guest demonstrator and workshop teacher. Interest in this event has exceeded our expectations and now (12 January) we have 14 woodturners committed to participating in the hands-on workshop. One fine man is coming from Seattle and a pair from Regina, who are familiar with Paul Fennell from a visit he made there 2 summers ago, but have only seen him demonstrate but without hands-on experience are coming, plus Dave Webster, who has come to our workshops regularly, from Calgary. If there are no more registrants we will have 7 participants in each session. It looks like we will be borrowing a few lathes! I'm happy enough if we don't get any more for the workshop because at some point the numbers begin to dilute the personal attention, which is such a great feature of these workshops.

There is no restriction on the Saturday 19 May demonstration. Come one, come all!

ACACA fills a unique niche in promoting the arts in the province of Alberta by sponsoring three juried art shows annually, hosted by art clubs from different communities each year. This year The Southern Zone Juried Show & Sale will be hosted by **The Lethbridge Artists Club**.

The works of art are critiqued at the conclusion of each show, providing encouragement and learning experiences, in an environment that encourages new ideas, networking, and goodwill. Winners of the Zone show are then juried again at the <u>Alberta Wide Show</u>. Awards are presented annually for each Zone show and the Alberta Wide Show. Winners from the Alberta Wide Show are hung in a smaller gallery at the <u>Alberta Spirit show</u>. ACACA owns a permanent collection of award winning works, which are purchased from the artist every year.

My interest in wood turning began in my early teens when Aaron Martin, a very skilled (Old Order Mennonite) machinist helped me build a wood lathe. We had the head and tailstock cast at a local foundry and used channel iron for the bed.

I turned a few spindles in a little shop in our basement. After high school, I sold it because life would be too busy.

After moving to Coaldale, I owned a Beaver lathe for years but used it rarely. During the early 90's I attended a woodworking show and came across Dale Nish, from Provo Utah. He was a very capable turner. Impressed by his skill, and aided by several of his books, I improved my skills. Attending courses with Ray Key and Richard Raffan at Craft Supplies in Provo in 1996 and '97 broadened my experience and skills. Over the next decade I upgraded my equipment and sold turnings at craft sales from Pincher Creek to Edmonton. During this time I was privileged to introduce a number of southern Albertans to this diverse craft. Their support and interest led to the formation of our Club.

It's mainly about the wood! Since childhood I have collected it in all it's varieties. Turning it into something attractive and (at times) useful involves using a "different part of your brain". In these changing and unpredictable times, that can have significant benefits.

Over the past decade, I have become very impressed with the activities, innovation and support of the Club's executive. This has lead to the formation of a dynamic group of artisans whose work shows remarkable increase in skill and variety. And I'm sure this is just the beginning!
