# How to join a Zoom Meeting

This information is from a previous Central Alberta Woodturners newsletter

# On desktop, tablet or phone by downloading the app.

- Download the **Zoom desktop app** on your Mac or PC. <a href="https://zoom.us/download">https://zoom.us/download</a>
- 2. Open the **Zoom app**.
- 3. Click Join a Meeting.
- 4. Enter the **Meeting ID** and your **name**, and set **audio/video permissions**.

On desktop, tablet or phone via meeting invite link.

- Click on the Meeting Invite URL that the host shared
- 2. via email or text.
- 3. Open the **Zoom app**.
- 4. **Approve** the request for **permission** to use your computer's **audio and camera**.

Depending on the meeting's set-up:

- you may enter the meeting right away
- you may need to wait for the host to arrive first or
- you may be placed into a waiting room that the host controls.

# ANDRÉ'S PREFERRED WEB SITES OF THE MONTH

hristmas ornaments are a popular topic ✓ these days as we all want to surprise Lorraine with different ornaments. Are you aware of the Annual Ornament Challenge organized by Alan Stratton (https://www.aswoodturns.com/). This is the 10th edition this year. In the past, Alan has co-hosted the friendly challenge with Carl Jacobson (https://thewoodshop.tv/), Mike Peace (https://www.mikepeacewoodturning.com/) and this year with Matt Deighton, a Utah woodturner who runs the Woodturners Worldwide virtual group (https://www.woodturnersworldwide.com/). You need only send a picture to enter the challenge and become eligible for prizes. I am not sure if Canadians are eligible for the prizes. The link to participate is <a href="https://www.aswoodturns.com/">https://www.aswoodturns.com/</a> challenges/. Good success and Lorraine will be enthused to see some of your ornaments for the upcoming sale this weekend going to the Chinook Regional Hospital Foundation. If you do not want to repeat the same ornaments as last year, a great display of ornaments from last year's Ornament Challenge can be viewed for inspiration starting at 2min 25 sec on the kickoff announcement of the 2021 challenge (https:// youtu.be/hOeonF-wgVY).

This past May, we had the immense pleasure to have David Ellsworth (https://ellsworthstudios.com/ about-david), an icon among woodturners, to demonstrate for us. Another charter member of the AAW (American Association of Woodturners) still active with turning is John Jordan. John is in the Nashville area, Tennessee. He prefers to use fresh cut logs as he likes the responsiveness of green wood. His works is exhibited in the most prestigious museums and galleries in the USA and Europe. He is a regular contributor to the American Woodturner magazine since the beginning as well as other magazines. Stop by his web site (<a href="https://www.johnjordanwoodturning.com/">https://www.johnjordanwoodturning.com/</a>) and you will discover his spectacular and elegant carved hollow forms, fantastic tea pots, and his recent vases with metal lid. Stunning work! He also offers courses in his studio and classes in different woodturning schools in North America and Europe as well as IRD (Interactive Remote Demonstrations). He would be a great demonstrator to invite to Lethbridge. With Christmas coming up and if you are missing only one tool, he could help you as he is marketing his own tools on his web site as well as being a rep for a prestigious American lathe company.

There are many different methods to turn a wood sphere or a wooden ball, some easier than others. A dedicated jig can also be a fast option toward turning a perfect sphere. However, among the alternative methods, it can be turned simply by eye or using an approach termed as the octagon method which has been described in different articles and videos. Alan Stratton (https://www.aswoodturns.com/) has demonstrated the two different methods; the first one by eye (https://youtu.be/3lConTQ-cUw) and the second using some simple mathematical formulas to simplify the task (https://youtu.be/ u dp TAvX-s). Dennis Delaney, a former member of our Guild, did demonstrate the same octagon method many years ago during a demonstration of the flipping top. His handout must be still around. Dennis did also demonstrate turning a perfect sphere more recently using the shadow technique which was shown this spring by Theo Haralampou (https://www.woodturner.com.au/) on a Record Power sponsored demonstration. Whatever the approach you select, either way is a simple approach to get a perfect sphere according to Alan Stratton! Are we going to see perfect spheres among the different Christmas ornaments?
